PENTECOST by Fr. Harvey

The good news of Easter is much bigger than a day! In a sense, every Sunday (and every day!) is a celebration of the good news that Christ is alive. But all through May and continuing into the first days of June, we have been specially focusing on the good news of Christ's resurrection. Alleluia, alleluia!

The Easter season ends, and Pentecost begins, on June 5. Pentecost is not nearly so well known as Easter, but it, too, is one of the most important holy days in the Christian calendar.

Pentecost was originally a Jewish holy day celebrating the giving of the law on Mount Sinai. A few weeks after the first Easter, Jesus' followers gathered to celebrate the Jewish Pentecost. Suddenly the Holy Spirit came upon them, and they began to praise God in different languages. As the Acts of the Apostles tells the story (chapter 2), devout Jews from every nation heard the apostles praising God, each in their own language. People were amazed, Peter preached, and thousands of people joined the new movement.

As a result, Pentecost has become a major Christian holy day. If Christmas is the celebration of Christ's birth, Pentecost is the birthday of the Church.

I am always sad to say goodbye to the Easter season. But Pentecost is an inspiring (and inspiriting!!) day. I hope you will join us for worship that day (Sunday, June 5) if at all possible. And my prayer for us all is that we will catch the Spirit this Pentecost!

A group of us meet on Zoom on Tuesdays at 4:15 roughly every other week to talk about a chapter of Luke's Gospel, along with a very accessible guide by N.T. Wright called *Luke for Everyone*. Our June meetings will be the 7th and the 21st. Please join us!

FRIDAY NOONTIME HEALING EUCHARIST

Our Friday Bible Study meets at 1:00 every Friday, except June 3. Many of us gather in person in the Community Room, while a few others join us by Zoom. We are still working our way through the Gospel of John. All are welcome, and you don't have to have any background knowledge about the Bible—just an interest in learning!

CONTEMPLATIVE PRAYER ON FRIDAYS AT 2:30

We gather every Friday (again except June 3!) at 2:30 for a session of contemplative prayer. We read a passage of Scripture three times, interspersed with short periods of silence. The basic question we ask ourselves is, what is God saying to me through this passage? Our sessions are hybrid: some of us gather in person while others join us on Zoom. Please join us in whatever way is most comfortable for you!

MORNING PRAYER:

We continue our schedule of livestreamed Morning Prayer Tuesdays through Fridays at 8:00 AM, with Terry or me leading on Fridays. Please tune in as you are able. But also remember that we put forms in the narthex for seasonal versions of Morning Prayer and also for Compline. Beginning June 5, that means versions for Pentecost. They're intended to help you say Morning Prayer or Compline on your own. Joining us or praying Morning Prayer or Compline on your own is a great way to add a little prayer into your weekly routine!

BELOVED COMMUNITY

The Beloved Community Commission of our Diocese is working on Juneteenth, which falls on a Sunday this year. As you have probably heard, Juneteenth (June 19) commemorates the day the last enslaved people in the United States learned that they were free. Juneteenth is a celebration for all Americans, a chance to acknowledge the progress we have made towards becoming a "more perfect union" truly dedicated to the proposition that all people are created equal. It's also a day to recall how far we still have to go. We'll acknowledge the day in our services at Saint David's. But I invite everyone to pause for a moment on the 19th to reflect with thanksgiving on our national ideals.
